- † **Mr. Juan Chamorro**, father of Reverend Fr. Hans Chamorro, parochial vicar at Saint David Church, died Nov 18. The funeral Mass took place at 11:30 a.m. Nov. 30 at St. Michael the Archangel Catholic Parish and he was buried at Our Lady of Mercy Catholic Cemetery.
- † **Deacon John Kroll**, who was ordained in the Archdiocese of Miami in 1986, died recently. He served at St. Boniface Catholic Parish, the Scott Memorial Center for the Deaf and Disabled, and St. Maximilian Kolbe Catholic Parish until his retirement and move to Ocala.

Jubilee 2025

The Archdiocese of Miami, in communion with the Universal Church and Pope Francis, will open the Jubilee Year of 2025 with a solemn Mass at St. Mary's Cathedral, 7525 NW 2nd Ave on Saturday, Dec. 28, at 5:30 PM.

The Jubilee Year will offer the faithful opportunities to participate in various jubilee events at the Vatican and in their own dioceses. For pilgrims who cannot travel to Rome, bishops around the world have designated their cathedrals or a popular Catholic shrine as special places of prayer for Jubilee Year pilgrims, offering opportunities for reconciliation, indulgences and other events intended to strengthen and revive faith.

The following churches and shrines have been designated as special places of prayer for Jubilee Year Pilgrims:

- Cathedral of St. Mary, Miami, 7525 NW 2nd Avenue, Miami
- The National Shrine of Our Lady of Charity (La Ermita), 3609 South Miami Avenue, Coconut Grove (Miami)
- Our Lady of Schoenstatt Shrine, 22800 SW 187th Ave, Homestead
- St. Mary Star of the Sea Basilica, 1010 Windsor Lane, Key West
- St. Clement Catholic Church, 2975 N. Andrews Avenue, Wilton Manors

The basic conditions to gain an indulgence are that a person is moved by a spirit of charity, is "purified through the sacrament of penance and refreshed by Holy Communion" and prays for the pope. Groups of faithful who wish to organize pilgrimages to one or more of the above designated churches or shrines should coordinate with the designated site so that the pilgrims can be properly welcomed and have access to the Sacraments, especially confession.

Spiritual Exercises of St. Ignatius of Loyola

The Spiritual Exercises of Saint Ignatius of Loyola will be offered at the University of Saint Mary of the Lake Conference Center in Mundelein, Illinois from July 2 to Aug. 4, 2025. A team of trained spiritual directors will offer the 30-day, 8-day, 5-day, and 3-day forms of the Spiritual Exercises. The program is co-sponsored by Jesus Youth and Amoris Christi.

The cost for the 30-day retreat is \$3,800 and includes all materials and stipend for spiritual direction. The 3, 5 and 8 day retreats cost \$150 per day. Preference for admission to the 30-day retreat is given to bishops, seminary formators, vocation directors, priests, deacons and their wives, religious and lay leaders involved in spiritual formation and evangelization.

The Pontifical Choir will sing for major liturgical celebrations in the life of the archdiocese celebrated by the Archbishop of Miami in his Cathedral-Church and elsewhere. These include Chrism Mass, ordinations of deacons, priests, and bishops, the Rite of Election, the Rite of Reception, the annual Wedding Anniversary Mass, and the Archbishop's Thanks-for-Giving Mass.

The liturgical obligations of the choir are such that they will not interfere with a chorister's participation in their parish's music program. Most liturgies are on Saturday mornings or Sunday afternoons at the Cathedral of Saint Mary in Miami.

Membership in the choir is open to organists, choir directors, cantors, and other singers from throughout the three-county area of the archdiocese. The ability to read music, though recommended, is not required. Only a simple placement audition and the ability to commit to the rehearsal schedule is necessary. Regular rehearsals will be on Saturday mornings, approximately twice monthly at the cathedral.

Office of Safe Environment

Safe Environment Local Coordinator

The Archdiocese of Miami's administration has reevaluated the Safe Environment Office in all aspects including the general policy, staffing and assigning of responsibilities, reporting procedures, requirements to serve as either an employee, vendor, or volunteer, and compliance procedures all in accordance with the USCCB's Charter for the Protection of Children and Vulnerable Adults.

An imperative part of ensuring compliance for our entities is the assigning of a Local Coordinator for your site. The Local Coordinator is responsible for compliance and record keeping of the Archdiocesan Creating and Maintaining Safe Environments for Children and Vulnerable Adults Policy. Essentially, this means ensuring that compliance is met and that it can be proven. (Remember the SE Office is an independently audited office.)

The role description is extensive and requires training before access is given. If your site does not have a local coordinator, please contact the Safe Environment office at irayburn@theadom.org for the Role Description, and consider your choice carefully. Once a candidate is identified contact the Safe Environment Office again with the name and email address of the candidate so they may be assigned the appropriate training. This person must already be compliant in Virtus, fingerprinting, and a signed Pledge to promote safe environment.

Ultimately, the responsibility falls to the Pastor, Principal, or Director of the site. Thank you for joining the Archdiocesan's efforts to protect children and vulnerable adults.

Report the fake account immediately to the social media platform and let the archdiocesan Communications Office know by emailing mrivas@theadom.org.
